WHEREAS, New Prince Concrete Construction Co., Inc., Hackensack, NJ was awarded a contract for the 2019-2021 Road Program for Curbs, Sidewalk, Driveway & ADA Ramps Improvements (the "Project"), in the amount not to exceed \$2,270,605.00; and

WHEREAS, the Township previously approved a change order in the amount of \$12,500.00 for a final cost of \$2,283,105.00, a 0.55% increase; and

WHEREAS, additional work is necessary for the Project that was not included in the original scope of work outlined by the Township and not anticipated in the proposal from New Prince Concrete Construction Co., Inc. to the Township for the Project; and

WHEREAS, this change order would represent an additional \$15,100.00 increase in the total amount of the Project for a final total not to exceed \$2,298,205.00, a 0.66% increase of the initial contract amount, for a total increase of 1.21%; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-11.3 authorizes a municipality to approve change orders up to twenty (20) percent of the originally awarded contract; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a change order form, dated November 16, 2020, the Township Director of Public Works recommends approving the Change Order Request No. 2; and

WHEREAS, there is funding available pursuant to certification # R-2020-0007-02;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Council of the Township of Piscataway, that the appropriate municipal officials be and are hereby authorized to amend the total contract amount for the Project with New Prince Concrete Construction Co., Inc., Hackensack, NJ from \$2,283,105.00 to a final total not to exceed \$2,298,205.00 and execute the enclosed Contract Change Order in the amount of \$15,100.00, subject to all bid specifications and contract documents.

RESOLUTION #20-356

WHEREAS, pursuant to U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regulations, the County of Middlesex had executed triennial agreements with municipalities, including the Township of Piscataway, that comprised an "Urban County" and enabled those participating municipalities access to receiving certain federal funding, including through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program and the HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME); and

WHEREAS, for the next triennial cycle, the Township of Piscataway has now qualified to receive a direct allocation from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, starting with federal fiscal year 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Piscataway would still like to participate with the County of Middlesex for the HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) and be part of the HOME Consortium of municipalities (not covered under the Urban County designation); and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid procedure entitles the County to administer federal funds on behalf of the HOME Consortium municipalities for the provision of certain eligible activities under the Home Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program; and

WHEREAS, CPD Notice 13-002, provides the procedures for authorizing and automatically renewing the aforesaid agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Piscataway and the County of Middlesex confirm the Township's participation in the HOME Consortium for Fiscal Years 2021-2023, and executed a Cooperation Agreement for this purpose; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Council of the Township of Piscataway, that the appropriate municipal officials confirm the execution of the HOME Cooperation Agreement with the County of Middlesex for Federal Fiscal Years 2021-2023; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township of Piscataway is confirming that they will not be a member of the Middlesex County Urban County for the period covering Federal Fiscal Years 2021-2023 and will instead be its own CDBG entitlement community; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the appropriate municipal officials shall be and are hereby authorized to execute all documents in connection with said matters; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Clerk of this Board shall forward certified copies of this resolution to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and the County of Middlesex.
